**Directions:** From Pinellas take I275 to I4, I4 to I75 south, go to the Gibsonton Drive exit # 250 go east on Gibsonton Drive it will turn into Boyette road when you cross US 301, keep heading east on Boyette road it will turn into Fishhawk Ranch Blvd keep heading east on Fishhawk to Lithia Pinecrest turn left or north on Lithia Pinecrest the Landings will be a couple miles up Lithia Pinecrest on your right. There is a light at Lynx Paw turn right on Lynx Paw and right into parking lot.

If you use a Sunpass and coming from south or central Pinellas or south Tampa you can take the Leroy Selmon expressway from Gandy and Dale Mabry in Tampa to I75 South. This will be a little shorter and faster but you have tolls.

If you are using GPS it will most likely tell you to take Bloomingdale Blvd to Lithia Pinecrest. This is the shortest way but not the fastest. Traffic lights, heavy traffic on these roads are brutal so Chuck suggests you take Gibsonton Drive off of I75. It will add a few miles but save a lot of your time.
